CASPAR Emergency Services & Shelter: The CASPAR Emergency Services Center (ESC) is a 24 hour shelter for adults, with no sobriety requirements for admission. The ESC uses a reserved bed system for 52 beds, and a lottery system for 8 emergency beds. At the ESC, guests have access to meals, hygiene supplies, showers, clean clothes, medical care, and case management, and housing assistance. Weekdays, the staff includes a therapy dog, Maddie.

<u>Cambridge Warming Center</u>: The Warming Center is a welcoming and safe drop-in center where unsheltered adults can spend the night during the winter months. The Center is

open 11 hours each night, from November to mid-April. The Center offers a safe space, meals, showers, and the ability to rest on a yoga mat on the floor. Each night, guests may talk with expert staff to get a referral to physical and mental health care, addiction treatment services and housing services.

Lowell Transitional Living Center: Lowell Transitional Living Center is an emergency shelter for unaccompanied individuals over 18 years of age experiencing homelessness. In addition to emergency shelter, LTLC provides case management and referrals to community-based resources.

- Engagement Bed Program: Funded by the Department of Public Health, the
 Engagement Bed Program (EBP) is targeted toward people experiencing a housing
 crisis who are at high risk for Sexually Transmitted Infections including HIV, or those
 who have been previously diagnosed. Through the EBP, we provide information on
 risk reduction methods and connections to regular testing and counseling.
- Winter Emergency Bed Program: From November to April each year, LTLC operates
 the Winter Emergency Bed Program (WEBP) to provide additional capacity during
 the coldest months of the year. WEBP provides an extra 30 cots and includes access
 to shower, laundry, and meals, as well as outreach and engagement services.
- Shelter Diversion Program: The LTLC triage process includes meeting with a
 diversion specialist to determine if options to entering shelter can be identified.
 Diversion placements include substance use treatment, reunification with family or
 friends, medical respite beds, and domestic violence programs.
